
## Project Picker

NESD and the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) are joining forces to office work opportunities for high school students with disabilities! Project Picker aims to pair with various departments throughout the District to office paid work experience for students interested in a wide variety of areas. Students will also receive course



credit upon successful completion of their placement. Future plans for the program include expanding into local businesses. Set to launch at the beginning of the 2nd semester, eligible Juniors and Seniors have been meeting with OVR representatives throughout the month of November to make sure they are set up and ready to receive OVR support.

A reminder to all Juniors and Seniors with IEPs. OVR offers a wide variety of supports as you transition beyond high school. This can range from tuition assistance, job search support, or help with obtaining necessary tools or uniforms. Forms to begin this process have been sent home to all eligible Juniors and Seniors, but only a handful have been returned. #### **Progress Reports**

You should be receiving reports of your child's IEP goal progress within the next week. Please take a moment to look through these progress reports and reach out to your child's case manager if there are any questions or concerns. Progress monitoring is one of the activities central to the IEP, and can help to show growth when traditional grades cannot. For more information on how to read the progress reports or ideas for what you can do at home to support your child's goals, please reach out to your child's case manager.





### **Attention Parents**

As you may know, this year North East has been chosen to participate in the Pennsylvania Department of Educationals Cyclical Monitoring for Continuous Improvement. This process include the state coming in to make sure that North East continues to follow PDE and federal special education rules and regulations. One very important part of this process is obtaining parent input. You will be receiving a letter from the special education department requesting that you complete a survey. This survey should take no more than 15 minutes to complete and provides the district with important data to help us continue to improve our programs. The surveys are 100% confidential and do not collect any type of personally identifiable data. If you have questions regarding these surveys, please contact your child's Case Manager or the Director of Special Education.

Students 14 years of age or older are also encouraged to complete a student survey. This gives the district additional information related to our current programs. Again, no personal information is collected and the surveys are 100% confidential.
