Overview of the Trip (Day 1)

4:30 AM	Load for departure from NEMS at 5:00 Students MUST arrive between 4:30 and 4:50 and report to the gym.

Overview of the Trip (Day 2)

1:00	Lunch at Dobbin House (Included in the cost of the trip)

After 8:30	Arrive at NEMS (Parent broadcast will be done around Edinboro)



Important Notes

- All paperwork needs to be turned in (contact Mrs. Pyle ext. 2000)
- Money
 - \$200 buyout is due March 31st (for those not fundraising)
 - \$200 fundraising: students can fundraise into April
 - Fundraising total is due mid-April BUT can be paid off ASAP
 - Parent chaperones must have balance paid in full to be eligible
 - Students will only need money for fast food lunch (they can buy snacks)
 - Spending money. Students will stop in gift shops.
 - Students may only purchase items that would be permissible to bring to school. For example, no swords, guns, laser pointers, etc.
 - Admission to all activities, dinner on Thursday, and all meals on Friday included in the cost of the trip.
- Students may bring snacks and approved drinks, but no energy drinks or glass bottles are permitted.
- No game stations or wifi devices: Music players are allowed **IF** they don't connect to the internet (No Cell Phones or Smart Watches).
- Bring a camera.



Rules and Regulations

- ❑ Dress Code
 - ❑ Students must wear pants at all times, EXCEPT on the ride home when shorts are permitted.
 - ❑ Students must wear sneakers. No sandals/open toed shoes.
 - ❑ Hygiene - fresh clothes and more than one outfit
- ❑ No Cell Phones or Smart Watches
 - ❑ Chaperones will have phones and use Remind App to communicate as a whole
- ❑ Students must be with chaperones at all times outside of the hotel room. Chaperones have full authority.



Notes for Parent/Guardian

Chaperones

- ❑ Chaperone lottery sign-ups begin February 22nd and the window closes on March 1st. Sign up tonight or call 725-8671 ext. 2000
- ❑ The number of staff-chaperones will inform us of the number of parent-chaperones needed - we anticipate needing 3-7 parents
- ❑ Chaperones will be notified by 3/8/2023
 - ❑ To be a chaperone: student account must be paid in full and all paperwork/**clearances** must be completed ASAP.
 - ❑ Instructions for paperwork needed will be sent and the chaperone is responsible to get paperwork/clearances back to the NEMS office in April.
- ❑ You will walk a lot (8 miles on Thursday, 6 miles on Friday)
- ❑ You are responsible for your group (4-8 students)
- ❑ All chaperones must get off the bus at all stops on the battlefield. You are the role model and example!
- ❑ Mandatory 1 hour chaperone meeting Thursday, May 4 @ 5:45 pm.



Students Not Attending

- Students that do not attend will still be required to attend school those days.
- There will be work for the students that corresponds with the battle and Civil War.
- A middle school staff member will be with the students.
- The curriculum for the day will include Civil War content, a film study, and virtual tours of the battlefield.

Medication

- Primary Contact: Mrs. Mindi Fisher, RN
 - Forms must be returned to Mrs. Fisher
 - If your child needs to receive medication on the trip, including over the counter medication not stocked by the school, the school districts medication form must be filled out by your physician and notarized in our business office free of charge. If your student has a current medication form on file in the nurse's office you will not need another form for the trip unless your student requires other medications not listed on that medication form. Please plan to give your student any morning medications prior to leaving at home. ***NO medications forms will be accepted the morning of departure.***



Medication Cont'd

- INHALERS: Any student that has an asthma diagnosis must bring their inhalers with them on the trip regardless of whether they require them during school hours or not. The climate will be different there as spring arrives earlier than here. Your student will need to check in the morning of departure and visibly show the nurse that they have their inhaler. The student will carry their inhaler on their person at all times. Your *student will have to have their inhaler to board the bus for departure.*



Medication Cont'd

- ALLERGIES: If your student has environmental/food allergies and takes over-the-counter medications you will need to have a medication form filled out. ***If your child has a severe allergy reaction requiring specific doses of Benadryl or an Epi-Pen a medication form must be completed and the Epi-Pen shown to the nurse the morning of the trip.***
- FORMS/MEDICATION PREPARATION: Please have all medication forms turned into the nurse's office by Friday, April 14th. If your student requires medication on the trip, you will then receive instructions and medication envelopes to fill out and return the week of May 1st.



Medication Cont'd

- STOCK MEDICATIONS: The nurse will have a small amount of stock medications for minor issues on the trip. Students are permitted to bring sunscreen, bug/tick spray, personal hygiene/care products, especially your daughters for their needs and appropriate clothing, good shoes for walking long distances and no flip flops.
- POSSESSION OF MEDICATIONS: North East School District Policy states that any student in possession of any chemical other than a registered inhaler will be subject to assigned consequences of violating the policy

Student Groups

- ❑ Students select one partner/buddy in February/March
- ❑ If the paperwork is complete the buddies are locked in
 - ❑ No Drama between now and May!
 - ❑ Partner/buddy could change if money, discipline, or academics cause a student to be removed
- ❑ The 8th grade team and administrators assign groups and hotel rooms.
- ❑ Students will be notified of their bus number and assigned seating the morning of the trip when they report to the gym.
 - ❑ Always paired with the partner/buddy
- ❑ The students, staff, and chaperones make these groups work. This trip has been a success since the 20th Century!

Friendly Suggestions:

- Please discuss with your child how they should budget their money. Some food and souvenirs are the only “costs”
 - Do not splurge all at once and compare prices
- Plan accordingly based on the weather! Example, if it looks like rain then send extra shoes and a plastic bag for the wet clothing.
- Health/Hygiene reminder: HBC, sunscreen, ticks, allergies (south-central Pa is ahead of our seasonal allergies) - all medications (allergies, travel, and/or anxiety et cetera) must flow through our nurse, Mrs. Fisher.
- Please reinforce expectations of behavior and conduct throughout the trip.
 - North East has a reputation among agencies, tour guides, and business owners for being the exemplar of respect and positive behavior - let's keep the reputation strong!!!



Final Thoughts

- This is a fantastic opportunity for your child. We want this to be a rich experience, both academically and personally.

- ☐ Important Reminders:
 - ☐ We all represent North East
 - ☐ You are responsible for your group (4-6 students)
 - No student should be without an adult/chaperone
 - ☐ You will walk a lot (8 miles on Thursday, 6 miles on Friday)
 - ☐ All chaperones get off the bus at all stops on the battlefield. You are the role model and example!
- ☐ Thursday Morning Expectations - Depart @ 5:00 am
 - ☐ Arrival 4:30 am - Middle School Gym
 - Meet & Greet with your bus/group and bag check
- ☐ Chaperone Folder
 - ☐ Contact info and numbers (Remind App: @g-burg2022)
 - ☐ Bus groups - chaperones' groups - bus seating chart - itinerary
- ☐ Odds & Ends:
 - ☐ Permitted souvenirs and historical paraphernalia - when in doubt ask staff
 - ☐ Student Money/Budget: Load the bus WITH cash on person
 - Save ALL receipts - students should not spend all money at one stop

WHAT DO YOU NEED FOR GETTYSBURG?

- ☐ A watch that works (not a “Smart” watch)
- ☐ A comfortable pair of walking shoes (NO FLIP-FLOPS/NO OPEN TOES) and a spare pair in case of mud/water. Bring a plastic bag for dirty shoes.
- ☐ Comfortable, appropriate clothing for two days. Long pants and high white socks are best. Shorts will not be permitted except for on the bus ride home.
- ☐ Weather appropriate attire. We will be walking outside rain or shine. You may want to bring an umbrella, raincoat, sunglasses, hats...etc. Be prepared. Think layers.
- ☐ Toothpaste, shampoo, DEODORANT, and any other NEEDED toiletry articles.
- ☐ No backpacks or purses are allowed in any of the buildings – so please carry a wallet or a “fanny” pack. All backpacks will be left on the bus.
- ☐ Money for one meal on Thursday and one meal on Friday (approximately \$25).
- ☐ Souvenir money, if you so desire. The purchase of any confederate paraphernalia will be prohibited as will the purchase of any weaponry or any modern day depictions of weaponry. Souvenirs should be reflected of the time period. *
- ☐ Snacks for the trip down and back (NO GLASS BOTTLES. Beverages need to be in clear, resealable containers. No personal water bottles.)
- ☐ A camera (Disposables are great.)
- ☐ Bug/Tick spray and sunscreen
- ☐ iPods are permitted for music only. No iPod touches, etc.
- ☐ ABSOLUTELY NO CELL PHONES/SMART WATCHES/NO GAMING SYSTEMS/NO DEVICES THAT CAN CONNECT TO THE INTERNET.
- ☐ An extremely good attitude and patience
