
NEMS-Beves

- -Academic and personal growth






School wide Discipline

The building maintains a holistic approach to discipline. It is tiered and utilizes the team structure through the use of recognizing, identifying, teaching, counseling, supporting, and encouraging student to make the right choices.

Students are made aware of rules, expectations, and consequences at the beginning of the school year to set them up for success.



• Interscholastic: Athletic activities or events whose primary purpose is to foster competition between schools and school districts. PIAA starts in 7th grade.



• Intramural: Activities or events held within the school day, or shortly thereafter, whose primary purpose is to encourage all student to participate regardless of ability. They are student driven.

Inclusion

The Middle School utilizes a co-teaching model in which learning support teachers and regular education teachers collaborate to meet the needs of all students. Students identified with disabilities are included in their least restrictive environment. Teachers meet daily during a team plan period to discuss instructional goals, student issues, and other pertinent matters facing children in each grade level.

Parent Teacher Conferences

Middle School conferences are done with teams of teachers. There isn't an expectation that every child's parent attend a conference during conference days. That doesn't mean you can't set something up with your child's teachers at any time during the year.

- Call the office to report attendance before 7 a.m. You can leave a message on the answering machine.

- *Excuses (3 Days of attendance)
- *Unexcused or Unlawful absences (no excuse after 3 days of in-person attendance)
- 3 Unlawful Absences = TRUANT



- 4+ Unlawful Absences = referral to COURT
- ullet 6+ Unlawful Absences = Habitually Truant \longrightarrow COURT & referral to children and youth agency












